

Why is the Columban Centre for Peace Ecology and Justice involved?

The St Columban's Mission Society is dedicated world-wide to the eradication of poverty and Third World Debt. The Columbans specifically approach their work from the standpoint of solidarity with the poor and the integrity of creation. We believe that the Church in our time must challenge the scandal of structural poverty (poverty caused by the way governments and institutions function) and spiraling violence. We believe that such challenges are basic to what the Gospel demands of Christians and that this concern for justice, peace and the integrity of creation is central to our missionary work.

The United Nations Millennium Goals aim to halve absolute poverty by 2015.
